(G) 'Why can't we all just get along? (True Community)': Matt Summerfield

We all need friends, right? But what does real friendship look like and how can we fully live out the Bible's "one anothers" not just with our friends, but with everyone that God connects us to – even with those who drive us crazy?!

The seminar is for all teams and also open to anyone who would like to see God move when they pray for others. Andy and Mike will take a very practical look at the basics of how we go about praying for one another.

(G) 'How to see in the dark': Patrick Regan

When we are bombarded with headlines telling us that communities are dangerous, poverty and war are ever present and that we are not good enough the way we are, it's very hard to see the possibility of transformation. So how do we go about seeing the world as God does and let his love overcome hate, brokenness and violence? How can we see in the dark?

(SA) 'Mission Impossible (part one)': David Westlake

God's Mission in the Old Testament: Flick through the pages of the Bible and you'll see God is on a mission: a mission involving grace, justice, freedom and change. But how is that mission worked out in the Old Testament and how can we join with others and get involved in his mission today?

(CL) 'Church ain't trendy': Mark Russell

How can you change the church from the inside out? How can you as a young person get involved to help make the church more relevant and real? How can we get the church to take young people more seriously? Mark is the youngest member of the Archbishops' Council of the Church of England, and knows how to do it!

(FOM) 'New start: Forgiven and accepted': 29th Chapter

If you've just become a Christian or want to know more about following Jesus then come along to find out more about how God feels about you. Let's dismiss the rumours and the hearsay and go straight to the source. No matter what your past may have looked like you will be glad to know that God offers you a new start!

(G) 'A music scene overview': Bishop Graham Cray

Lily Allen sings about God. Kings of Leon are preachers kids. Tori Amos is abnormally attracted to sin. The Script pray to a God they don't believe, while U2 worship the Magnificent. What's really going on with the music scene nowadays? Bishop Graham knows more about it than Zane Lowe. Doncha know.

(CL) 'Getting Collared: An Introduction to Ordination': Rev. Dr. Andy Emerton

How do you get to wear a dog collar and become a vicar in the Church of England? Is there a specific calling and do you have to like eating cucumber sandwiches? A practical session on the passion and process involved in training for ordained ministry with advice on how to become leaders of churches that share in God's mission.

(S) 'Starting university well': James Hewitt

With the stereotype student going out drinking, eating late night kebabs and sleeping around how can we follow Jesus in the midst of all of that? Being at uni is one of the most exciting times of our lives, so what can we do to get the best out uni and keep growing with Jesus? *Followed by the Student Reception.*

(GD) 'The greatest comeback in history': Chris Lane

No, not Man Utd in 1999, Liverpool in Istanbul or even Take That! Did Jesus really rise from the dead and what does this mean for our lives? If the resurrection is true it's much more than a happy ending to the Easter story, instead it changes everything.

(G) 'Soul Sista (part one): Being good': Rachel Gardner

'And God saw it was very good' (Genesis 1v31): Imagine the best place on earth and times it by a million. That's was Eden. But Adam and Eve decided they didn't need God. Fast forward to today and you don't have to be a genius to realise relationships can be hard. If we want good relationships we need to get back in touch with the creative design. Lets explore what Jesus means when he offers us life to the full and how can we be good when it comes to sex and relationships?

(G) 'Soul Man (part one): Horny': Andy Croft & Mike Pilavachi

Most of us guys are testosterone machines who - if you believe the stats - will think about sex nearly as much as we think about football. So are we all just a horny bunch of blokes? This session takes an honest look at what the Bible says about sex and relationships, why it says it, how we can follow it's teachings and what to do if we've already messed it up.

(G) 'God-Inspired Gossip (Prophetic Evangelism)': MJ Axelson

People have to see to believe. That's why Jesus tells us to preach and to heal. Sound scary? It doesn't have to be. In this seminar we'll see what the Bible has to say about speaking specific words into people's lives, get practical about how to do it and hear some real-life stories of guys who've given it a go!

(G) 'The Kingdom of God': Tre Sheppard

Jesus talked about the Kingdom of God all the time... do we? What did He mean with all the talk of pearls, yeast and treasure and what does it have to do with our everyday lives now? Join Tre for a deeper look into what Jesus was on about and what it means now.

(G) 'Live the life (Living a life of integrity)': Matt Summerfield

How does how you feel about yourself affect the way that you live your life? What does it mean to live a life of integrity? How do we live like Jesus in the worlds of school, home and anywhere else that we may find ourselves?

(S) 'Student Reception'

Off to uni? Come along and meet others who are in the same boat – it's a great chance to make some new mates before you even hit the halls!

(GD) 'What's all that stuff about women?': Gemma Foster

The Bible says a few things about women which might not immediately make sense – should ladies wear hats in church? Are women supposed to be silent in church? Gemma will set about unpacking some of the verses on women in the Bible, hoping to make sense of the perceived muddle!

(G) 'Loving the hell out of people': Patrick Regan

The world's pretty messed up right? So as followers of Jesus should we just wait 'til everything goes wrong and the end comes? No! God wants his creation to have life before death not just life after death. As his followers we can be part of his

strategy for changing the world through the insignificant and in the words of mother Teresa to 'Love until it hurts'.

(G) 'Infectious faith' (Communicating the Gospel): Matt Summerfield

Are you the only one who finds sharing you faith with your mates tough? Of course, not! So let's take the pressure off and think about what this Good News is really all about anyway! How we can grow an infectious faith that impacts the lives of those around us?

(G) 'Stuck in a moment': James Grier

Do you ever feel a bit stuck in your Christian life? Paul said he knew the good he wanted to do but couldn't do it and instead he did the bad he didn't want to do! So, if like St Paul, we're stuck how do we get unstuck? You might be stuck with a particular struggle, unhealthy attitude, or something that haunts you from the past. Come along for help to get unstuck!

(G) 'Get Out!': YWAM

The first of our two special morning sessions for those who've signed up for the *Get Out!* outreach and evangelism afternoons. Some practical info, inspiring stories and a chance to ask lots of questions before getting out and having a go!

(G) 'Worship (part two)': Mike Pilavachi

Ever heard the story of the donkey who carried Jesus into Jerusalem? Well, he thought all the crowds were applauding him. They weren't. They were cheering on Jesus, the guy he was carrying. Our second session on one of the Soul Survivor (and Biblical) basics explains how this story (and many others) will help us get back to the heart of worship.

What are some of basic things that every Christian should know about God? What does it mean to be all powerful? Was God bored before he created the Universe? What does philosophy and theology say as a response to these questions?

(SA) 'Mission impossible (part two)': David Westlake

God's Mission in the New Testament: Jesus starts his mission with an amazing declaration, one that harks back to the Old Testament and still makes sense for us today. Be inspired by God's mission and see how God wants you to join him and help make what seems impossible possible.

(CL) 'A crash course on leading small groups': Mark Russell

Small groups are important, but leading them can be hard work! The best small groups for young people are led by young people and so this seminar will offer practical help in picking up the tools to lead a group effectively and get the best out of those who come along.

(G) 'Engaging with Culture': Tre Sheppard

Can we really change the world? Or are we all just victims of culture's latest whim? How do we become people who actively influence our culture rather than just reacting to it? If we're the light of the world as Jesus said, how do we go into the dark places without losing the plot?

(FOM) 'Under new management: Jesus in charge': 29th Chapter

Jesus invites you to come just as you are, but he loves you way too much to let you stay as you are. God wants to get rid of all the old issues and chains, he wants to refit the old cracked and damaged walls of your life and build you up all new. Today we will be taking a look at what life is like when we give God the keys to our life and let Christ in the driving seat.

(G) 'Questions, questions (part one)': Michael Ramsden

What is the hardest question you can think of about the Christian faith? What question would you not want to be asked? Why does God allow suffering, aren't the stories of the Bible irrelevant, does God have a beard? Bring the questions – we'll try to provide some answers!

(GD) 'What the hell?': Chris Lane

Angels on clouds, pitch forks, weeping and gnashing of teeth or just plain old darkness? Join Chris for a discussion about hell, heaven and everything in between. You'll get to check out what the Bible does and doesn't say about this controversial subject.

(G) 'Soul Sista (part two): Looking good': Jo Littleddyke

'So God created man and woman in His own image... male and female He created them... The man and his wife were both naked and were not embarrassed or ashamed in each others presence' (Genesis 1v27 – 2v25): What do we see when we look in the mirror? Is there a way to stand confidently and not feel ashamed or embarrassed of who we are? God is good and we are made in his image, so that means we are good! Learn how we can begin to love who we are on the inside to help make loving what's on the outside possible!

(G) 'Soul Man The Ultimate man': Jason Gardner

Who is the ultimate man? *What* makes an ultimate man ultimate? Driving a four by four? A black belt in origami? Popularity with the ladies? Join the debate as we measure up a some 'real men' (Chuck Norris, Barack Obama and Brad Pitt) against Jesus to see how they compare.

(G) 'Don't waste your life!': MJ Axelson

We've got one life. Don't waste it! God created us to live with a single passion: to make Jesus look GOOD in all areas of our life. How on earth do we make the most of our lives for Jesus today? Discover your God-given gifts, dream up practical ways to use them every day and dare to speak out passionately for Jesus in the here and now.

(E) 'How can I be empowered by the Holy Spirit?': Jeannie Morgan

Who is the Holy Spirit? What is he like? Can I be filled with power like the disciples were? Can anyone receive a prayer language? Why do people fall over sometimes when people pray for them? Jeannie will be looking at some of these questions as well as giving space for us to be empowered by the Holy Spirit and receive from him.

(GD) 'Do all religions lead to God?': Gemma Foster

There are many different religions in our world, so do all roads lead to God in the end? This seminar unpacks some of the beliefs of the world's major religions and sets about outlining a positive response to what others believe.

(SA) 'Micah 6:8 Acting Justly': Anthony Watt

Justice is one of the key signs of the Kingdom here on earth. How do we follow the call of God to act justly in this world where there is so much inequality? In this session we'll share stories of ordinary people acting justly by making counter cultural choices with their lives and discuss how we can do this in whatever context we find ourselves in.

(G) 'Free to be me': James Grier

Who are you and who do you want to be? Are you living life to your full potential? God doesn't just think you're great because he thinks everyone is, instead he rates you in a way he rates no-one else. You have a unique personality, character and talents and God knows what they are but do you?! Discover some of your unique identity and live it to the max.

(G) 'Stories from the front line': Tom & Suzie Brock

Have you heard about some of the crazy things that have happened to people around the world? Not stories of 'wild animals attacking picnics' but stories of God showing up and doing some absolutely amazing stuff? Come and be encouraged, inspired and equipped by hearing first hand what God has been doing around the place!

(G) 'Get Out!': YWAM

The second of our two special morning sessions for those who've signed up for the *Get Out!* outreach and evangelism afternoons. Some practical info, inspiring stories and a chance to ask lots of questions before getting out and having a go!

(G) 'The perfect worshipper (part three of our worship series)': Ben Cantelon

Worship music has become trendy. It's what sells in the Christian bookshops and it is now the driving force of Christian music all together. This is a good thing, but along the way we have had seminars, books and videos on how to become a better

worshipper... or the perfect worshipper. How do we stay creatively fresh, true to biblical principles and true to ourselves?

(SN) 'SoulNet: Your questions answered' Jason Gardner and Mike Pilavachi

'But my church just don't want to let the young people do anything, what can I do?', 'My group just burnt down all their tents... their parents are going to kill me!'. There are loads of pressures involved in being a youth worker, but what are your questions? Come along, ask about youth work and Soul Survivor and share your stories, hopes and struggles too.

(E) 'The Holy Who?': Andy Croft

'The Father'? Sure. 'Jesus'? Yep. The Holy WHO? The Holy Spirit is the least talked about member of the Trinity. Just who is he? Is he even in the Bible? Is he just a nice feeling? What does he like? Why does he do weird things? Is he that important? Come and get to know the Holy Spirit better...

(G) 'Has the Christian faith failed you?': Michael Ramsden

Many people say that the Christian faith has failed; others live in fear that it will fail. Someone once said that our culture is Christ-haunted, rather than Christ-centred. What do you do if you come to the conclusion that even if the Christian faith is true, it is a little disappointing?

(SA) 'No regrets': Emily Vesey

Apparently, the thing most people regret at the end of their lives is the fact that they didn't take enough risks; they didn't invest enough heart and just didn't love enough. Will we say the same thing or will we dare to be different and take big risks for God? A look at how Amos and others have relied on God lived boldly and loved well!

(CL) 'Adventures in Biblical understanding': Jason Gardner

The Bible has often been described as God's love letter but apparently we're not great at helping people fall in love with it! We'll be focussing on the challenge of introducing the Bible to those who aren't so keen on reading, as well as looking at cutting edge approaches to teaching.

(FOM) 'New lifestyle: Extreme makeover': 29th Chapter

Gok Wan tells us how to make the most of what we've got whereas Trinni and Suzanna say what's hot and what's not. But we need to know that God is much more concerned with what's deep in our hearts than how we look on the outside. We'll be taking a look past the superficial trappings of accessory styling, to look at God's makeover plan for our lives!

(E) 'What on earth am I doing for heaven's sake!': Mark Russell

Does God have a purpose for your life? Has he called you? Can God use you to change the world? Yes, yes and yes! But how on earth do you work it out? How can you discern God's will? Come to this seminar and find out...

(G) 'Learning to be good news': Bishop Graham Cray

Is discipleship more about what we do or what we don't do as Christians? How can we do discipleship that benefits other people? What did Jesus say about this, and how can we be good news to our friends, families and neighbours?

(G) 'Questions, questions (part two)': Michael Ramsden

Another chance for you to come along with some more difficult questions about faith. *'Isn't religion really responsible for all the world wars?', 'Did Jesus really come back to life?' or 'should Christians wear sandals?'* Bring the question you'd hate to be asked and we'll try to provide some answers!

(GD) 'A Rough Guide to the Apocalypse': Chris Lane

What does the Bible really teach about the 'end times'? And how should this teaching affect our lives? Is the world going to be destroyed? Is George Bush the Antichrist, or is it David Beckham? What is God's plan for the future, for us, for the world and the whole universe? Big questions, all of which we'll look at in this session!

(G) 'Soul Sista (part three): Doing good': Helen Rushton

'Be fruitful and increase in number, fill the earth and subdue it. Rule over it' (Genesis 1.28):

What's the point of getting out of bed when the alarm rings? What's it all about? God didn't create us to stand around and look pretty. He designed us with a purpose; for relationship and to be a blessing to the world. And that design isn't a "one size fits all". It's unique to each one of us. We are asked to "do" as much as we are asked to "be". A look at God's original plan for us and how we discover his unique purpose for our lives.

(G) 'Soul Man (part three): Stuff guys were born to do': Andy Croft & Mike Pilavachi

Football, Playstation, chin-ups... there is lots of stuff us guys are great at. There are a few things we struggle with. This seminar looks at a whole host of issues, from building good friendships and relating to our Dads right through to taking risks and going on adventures.

(E) 'Receiving, using and developing the Gifts of the Holy Spirit': Jeannie Morgan

What are gifts of the Holy Spirit? How can I receive them? How do I know that what I'm thinking or feeling is actually God and not just me? How can I use the gifts God gives by his spirit? A session with plenty of opportunity to receive and use prophetic words and some of the other gifts too.

(G) 'Wholly/Holy Worshipping': Simon Hall

God gave us music so that we could enjoy him and express what's on our hearts. But what if you can't play an instrument, or even sing? The Bible teaches us how we can worship God with all the gifts of life: creativity, passion, friendship, work, anger at injustice and more. Come along to be inspired... singers and instrumentalists are welcome too!

(G) 'Hmmmm...': Andy Croft

On one level following Jesus is simple. On another, when we stop and think about it, it can tie our brains in knots! 'Do I have free will, or is God choosing all my actions for me?' 'What about sin - I know I shouldn't do it, but just what is it?' Lots of things that make you go hmmm.

(SA) 'Micah 6:8 Loving Mercy': Anthony Watt

Jesus asked us to 'be merciful, just as our father is merciful'. As followers of Jesus we are called to love God and our neighbour, but how do we love mercifully? Come along to hear stories of how we see mercy and compassion seep through into this world, and discuss some new ideas on how we can allow mercy to penetrate our lives.

(FOM) 'The crossroads: Where next?': 29th Chapter

The Christian walk is supposed to be just that, a walk! It's a journey ... and making a decision to follow Jesus is just the beginning. Today we will be looking at how we make our way on with Jesus, when the music is finished, the tent is packed away and it's just you on your Jack.

(E) 'Prophetic jam': Jeremy Webb

Does God speak today, and if he does, can he speak to me and through me? This seminar not only aims to answer these questions but also give you the chance to do some prophetic stuff; hence the jam. Not a musical thing, but a hands on chance to try the prophetic.

(G) 'I judge you, you judge me, we are one big family?': Riley Fisher

Have you ever felt judged, judged someone else, or even judged yourself? Walking into a church can be hard when you feel like everyone is staring at you and it's just as tough when those people at the back won't shut up when you're trying to listen. We can often feel like we're never good enough to be in front of God. So, how do we deal with all this judgment?

(G) 'Walk with them': Eddie Lyle

Christians worldwide are being marginalised, driven from their homes and their jobs, imprisoned, tortured and exiled into poverty. With some even murdered just because they chose to follow Jesus, there has never been a more important time to show support for followers of Jesus who are persecuted for their beliefs.

(G) 'Lessons I'm learning about walking with Jesus': Andy Croft

I've been a Christian for a few years now. I know I've got a lot left to learn but these are some thoughts on stuff God's been teaching me – mistakes I've made, things I've realised and stuff I wish I'd know a little earlier. A personal one, that'll hopefully point us to Jesus!

(GD) 'Living in Community': Anthony Watt

How do we follow all the 'one anothers' that Jesus showed us in our frantic and fragmented world. A good raw look at the great and the ugly side of life in community with one another and our neighbours. A pretty casual session, so come with questions or thoughts and discuss them together.

(G) 'Can God use me?': Tom & Suzie Brock

How does God find people to work for Him? How do you find your place or how do you find out you even have a place? Is there a place for you at all? Don't panic. There is. God has a unique plan for you, so come and find out where you fit in!



(E) 'Physical and Emotional Healing – doing it!': Jeannie Morgan

Does Jesus heal today? Can He use me? How can I be effective? How can I see more happening when I lay hands on people? Yes Jesus does heal today. He wants to use us. A practical seminar, with opportunities to get stuck in and see the power of God in action!

(G) 'Know God for yourself': Simon Hall

Sometimes we forget that God has perfectly revealed himself to us already. Jesus said that if we get to know him we will understand everything we need to know about his Father. And the best place to get to know Jesus is in the Bible. This seminar will help you to see how Jesus fits into God's plan for the universe, and will include lots of practical tips to help make reading the Bible more relevant and exciting.
